- (b) Of activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served;
- (c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor observed the lesson plan posted in the school age classroom was dated for February 22nd through February 26th, therefore, a current lesson plan for the week of February 29th through March 4th was not posted. Upon interview the director confirmed she had failed to update the lesson plans.

445 - Rest Period - Alternate Activity

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

(5) A child who does not sleep shall be permitted to play quietly and shall be visually supervised.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, review of documentation, and interview, the surveyor observed that at 1:53 p.m. three children from nine (9) months old to one (1) year-old were laying in three (3) cribs in the infant room awake. Review of the daily schedule revealed the infant's nap time was from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. Upon interview, the teacher confirmed nap time was from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. and when questioned stated that the childen were left in their cribs for the duration of nap time even if they did not sleep for the entirety of nap time.

Equipment

755 - Toys/Equipment/Furniture

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (1) All toys, equipment, and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
 - (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found two (2) high chairs located in the school age room that had food on their treys and in the seats. Upon interview the director acknowledged the high chairs had not been cleaned after breakfast.
