265 - Health, Safety, Comfort

General: Based on observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. A plunger was accessible to children in the hallway bathroom next to the toilet.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, educational requirements for a staff member hired on May 15, 2016 were not presented.

- (c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and
- (d) That offers a variety of creative activities including the following:
- 1. Art:

- 3. Dramatic play;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Observation of daily progam of activities and daily schedule of events revealed that they were not being implemented in the two toddler classrooms and one preschool classroom.

460 - Inaccessible Items Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives and sharp objects;
- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;
- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. In the toddler classroom, under the sink that the children use to wash their hands following a diaper change, were numerous plastic bags in an unlocked cabinet accessible to children.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(1) The premises shall be:

480 - Premises Requirements

- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. A wall mounted toilet paper holder in the bathroom, located in the bathroom between the schoolage classroom and the preschool classroom, was dismantled from the wall and placed on the back of the toilet, making it very difficult to get toilet paper when using the bathroom.

520 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. A ceiling vent in the infant room was dusty and

580 - Toilet Room **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (2) A toilet room shall:
- (a) 1. Be provided for each gender; or
 - 2. A plan shall be implemented to use the same toilet room at separate times;
- (b) Have a supply of toilet paper; and
- (c) Be cleaned and sanitized daily.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. The floor of the bathroom, between the schoolage classroom and the preschool classroom, was dirty.



Not In Compliance

585 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. In the toddler classroom, the changing table was not immediately adjacent to a sink as there is a half wall and door separating the changing table and the sink.

590 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. The bathroom vent, located in the bathroom between the schoolage classroom and the preschool classroom, was not working.

Hygienic Practices

625 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

 - 5. Easily cleaned; and
 - 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory practices. The changing pad in the toddler classroom had holes exposing the inner absorbent material.

635 - Diapering Practice Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (12) Staff shall disinfect the diapering surface after each child is diapered.
- (13) If staff wear disposable gloves, the gloves shall be changed and disposed after each child is diapered.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory practices. Following a diaper change in the toddler classroom, the staff member failed to sanitize the diaper changing pad.

650 - Toy Sanitation Procedure

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (4) Toys and other items that are considered mouth contact surfaces by a child not toilet trained shall be sanitized daily by:
- (a) Scrubbing in warm, soapy water using a brush to reach into crevices;
- (b) Rinsing in clean water;
- (c) Submerging in a sanitizing solution for at least two (2) minutes; and
- (d) Air dried.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory practices. Interview with toddler staff members in two classrooms revealed that both teachers are failing to use the regulatory method of sanitizing toys mouthed by children that are not toilet trained. Both staff members stated that the toys are placed in bleach water and air dried.



First Aid/Medication

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the expiration date on the bottle has passed.

Findings:

670 - Medication

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with the regulatory requirements regarding medication. Observations and interviews in two toddler rooms and a two-year-old classroom revealed that diaper creams are not maintained in a locked location; they are maintained in the children's diaper cubby or diaper bags. In the two-year-old classroom one tube of diaper cream was observed in a cubby about three feet from the ground, within reach of children; however, there were no children in the classroom at that time

- (20) An outdoor play area shall be:

 - 1. Litter;
 - 2. Glass;
 - 3. Rubbish; and
- 4. Flammable materials;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. There was litter scattered on the playground.

695 - Protective Surface Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(21) A protective surface shall:

- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb;
- 2. Swing; and
- 3. Slide; and
- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. A blue, domed, climbing structure failed to have any protective surface under or surrounding the structure in the fall zone.

Equipment Not In Compliance

710 - Play Equipment Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (24) Supports for climbing apparatus and large equipment shall be securely fastened to the ground.
- (25) Crawl spaces, such as tunnels, shall be short and wide enough to permit access by adults.
- (26) A sandbox shall be:
- (a) Constructed to allow for drainage;
- (b) Covered when not in use;
- (c) Kept clean; and
- (d) Checked for vermin prior to use.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. A blue climbing structure on the playground failed to be anchored to the ground.

755 - Toys/Equipment/Furniture

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (1) All toys, equipment, and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. A kitchen playset in the schoolage classroom had a door hanging by one hinge and the other hinge was broken.



760 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

940 - Frozen Food

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. A red stationary truck structure on the playground was missing two steering wheels. An outdoor pole playhouse with a yellow tarp roof was in poor repair as the tarp roof was almost completely ripped off.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. In the deep freezer there failed to be a temperature measuring device to determine if the food was maintained at a temperature of zero degrees fahrenheit or below. The freezer in the kitchen was observed to be eight(8) degrees Fahrenheit, failing to be maintained at a temperature of zero degrees fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. On Monday, December 11, 2017 a parent had signed the attendance log verifying their child's attendance for the week, although their child was still in attendance at the center.

1140 - Fire Drills Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (12) A fire drill shall be conducted during hours of operation:
- (a) At least monthly; and
- (b) Documented.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. A fire drill was not completed the month of November 2017.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to post documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, a current, dated, schedule of daily activities in the two-year-old classroom was not posted or presented.

1170 - Diapering/Handwashing

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(9) The proper methods of diapering and hand-washing shall be posted at each diaper changing area.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to post documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. In the toddler classroom, diapering proceedures were not posted near the diaper changing area.
