Findings:

General: Based on Observation and interview with the staff in charge, the childcare center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Located in the cafeteria, a group of twenty-six (26) children were being supervised in a group by one (1) staff member from 02:55 p.m. to 03:15 p.m., therefore the childcare center did not maintain the minimum staff-to-child ratios. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the children ranged from seven to eleven years-of age.

### 275 - Caregiver Alone

922 KAR 2:110. Section 4. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

(1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall:

(n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in Section 3(1)(e)6 of this administrative regulation;

General: Based on documentation, interview and observation the childcare center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request the staff in charge did not present verification that the criminal records check (CRC) had been completed for the employee with the re-hire date of 08/07/2016. The employee was observed working as the sole caregiver with twenty-seven (27) children from 02:55 p.m. to 02:58 p.m.

## 300 - Background checks/left alone

## 922 KAR 2:090. Section 6. License Issuance.

(5) An individual described in subsection (4) of this section shall:

(a) Submit to background checks described in paragraph (b) of this subsection;

- (b) May be employed or work with a child on a probationary basis for up to ninety (90) calendar days, pending completion of a:
- 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and

4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and

(c) Not be left alone in the presence of a child until copies of the background checks in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection have been received by the licensee.

#### Findings:

General: Based on documentation, interview and observation the childcare center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request the staff in charge did not present verification that the criminal records check (CRC) had been completed for the employee with the re-hire date of 08/07/2016. The employee was observed working as the sole caregiver with twenty-seven (27) children from 02:55 p.m. to 02:58 p.m.

#### 340 - Training

## 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

(14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½)

### hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request the staff in charge did not present verification that two (2) staff members with the hire dates of 07/24/2015 and 09/13/2013 had met the requirement of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment. Review of ETRIS confirmed the findings.

### 922 KAR 2:110. Section 2. General.

(7) In addition to the posting requirement of KRS 199.898(3), a child-care center shall post the following in a conspicuous place and make available for public inspection:

(a) Each statement of deficiency and civil penalty notice issued by the cabinet during the current licensure year;

(b) Each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year;

- (c) Information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's website as specified in KRS 199.897;
- (d) A description of services provided by the child-care center, including:

1. Current rates for child care; and

2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;

(e) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and

(f) Daily schedule.

### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation the childcare center failed to post documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. The staff in charge did not present verification that, the requirement that each statement of deficiency issued by the cabinet during the current licensure year and each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year and each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year was not readily accessible for public inspection.
