Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff member in charge did not present verification that the file for a child with enrollment date of 9/9/19 contained a current immunization certificate. The staff member in charge acknowleged that the immunization certificate was not available at the time of the survey.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to post documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of posted documentation revealed each statement of deficiency issued by the cabinet during the current licensure year and each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year were not posted. Interview with the staff member in charge revealed that the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.
