## Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulations for background checks. Review of presented staff files and the KARES surveyor report revealed that two (2) staff members with the hire dates of 10/15/2018 and 03/01/2019 were not found. Interview with the director revealed the request for a determination of clearance from the Kentucky National Background Check Program, (NBCP) has not be initiated.

Interview with the director revealed the requested documentation was unavailable at the time of survey.
It was observed that the staff member with the hire date of 10/15/2018 was the sole caregiver for seven (7) two-year-old children in the Two's room on the date of survey. Further observation revealed the staff member with the hire date of 03/01/2019 was working alongside a qualified staff member in the infant room with eight (8) infants in the age range from four-months-old to nine-months-old on the date of survey.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulations for staffing requirements. Observation in the infant room revealed a qualified staff member entered the room carrying an eleven-month-old child. The aforementioned staff member handed the eleven-month-old child to another staff member and then walked out of the infant room and proceeded to walk back down the hallway into the one's room.

Observation of the one's room revealed seven (7) one-year-old children in the sole care of a staff member upon the aforementioned qualified staff member's return, making the one's classroom non-compliant for staff-to-child ratio, with one (1) staff member and seven (7) one-year-old children for a determined amount of time of two (2) minutes.

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half ( $1 \mathbf{1} / \mathbf{2}$ )
hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf ( $1 \mathbf{1} / 2$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

## Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files and ECETRIS report revealed fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training was not presented for review at the time of survey for seven (7) staff members with the hire dates of $12 / 02 / 2014$, 11/26/2012, 07/05/2016, 01/03/2012, 09/22/2016, 09/24/20085, and 10/17/2014.

Interview with the director revealed this information was unavailable at the time of survey.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding the outdoor play area. The small playground revealed there was not enough protective surface under the swing or slide, evidenced by exposed ground.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding equipment. Upon the surveyor's arrival in the infant room at 10:45am, three (3) infants of the age of four-months-old, seven-months-old and eight-months-old were observed sleeping in swings.

Upon return in the infant room at 11:05am, the same three (3) infants were still asleep in swings.

## Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. The records for two (2) children with the enrollment dates of 09/07/2018 and 09/07/2018 did not contain a preferred hospital.

Interview with the director revealed the requested documentation was unavailable at the time or survey.

## 922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

(1) A child-care center shall maintain:
(c) Daily attendance records documenting the arrival and departure time of each child, including records that are required in accordance with 922 KAR 2:160, Section 13, if a child receives services from the child-care center through the Child Care Assistance Program;

## Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, child care center failed to maintain written records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of attendance records revealed one (1) child was signed in on 03/13/2019, but was not signed out on 03/13/2019. Continued review of attendance records on 03/14/2019 revealed this week's attendance had been verified in advance for two (2) children on the DCC-94E form.

## Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulations. The center failed to present fire drill logs within the year for review at the time of survey.

Interview with the director revealed the requested documentation was unavailable for the time of survey.
