- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff in charge did not present verification that a staff member with the hire date of 11/30/2021 had written documentation from a health care professional that the individual was free from active TB.



410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request the staff in charge did not present verification that staff members with hire dates of 11/12/2020; 8/3/2020; 9/14/2018; and 11/26/12 had completed the required fifteen (15) annual hours of cabinet approved early care and education training from June 2020 to July 2021.

Review of presented staff files revealed an employee's file with the hire date of 4/5/2021 that did not contain documentation that six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training required within the first three (3) months of employment had been completed. Review of ECE-TRIS report could not verify the trainings had been completed.

- (b) Be in a safe environment for preservation; and
- (c) Be forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. The black mini-fridge located in the infant room had a thermometer reading of fifty (50) degrees Fahrenheit at the time of the survey. Interview with the director confirmed the thermometer reading indicated the temperature was too high.
