2. A wall in the Younger Two-Year-Old Classroom contained two holes where a gate had recently been removed. Dry wall mud had been placed over an area; however, it had not been sanded smooth and painted.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

1. The Statement of Deficiency/Plan of Correction from the 1/16/20, renewal inspection was posted; however, the Statement of Deficiency/Plan of Correction from the most recent renewal inspection (2/26/21) was not posted.

2. The facility failed to post current rates for child care in a conspicuous place. The staff person in charge stated that this information is posted behind the front office counter.
