General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file for a volunteer who started at the facility on 9-25-17 did not contain evidence of submission for or the results of a central registry check. The file for a volunteer who started at the facility on 8-12-17 did not contain evidence of submission for or the results of a criminal records check. Neither of these volunteers was found to be left alone with children.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that three (3) infants and toddlers were seated in high chairs for lunch time. Although the safety straps were present on the highchairs, the straps were not engaged while the children were seated. In addition, it was found that one (1) of the cribs assigned to a child contained two (2) mattresses. The manufacturer's guidelines state that only the mattress that is designed for the crib it to be used. The facility did not have documentation from a physician stating that the crib was to be altered in this way.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that two (2) small slides each approximately one (1) foot tall were positioned on grass in the outdoor playground area.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:

- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that five (5) of the crib sheets were extremely loose and wrinkled.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the only milk available in the facility was fat free. During interview with the teachers, it was found that the fat free milk is regularly served to the one, two and three-year-old children. Whole milk was not available for the one-year-old children.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that three (3) of the children's lunches did not meet the required nutritional components. One (1) child had pizza, yogurt, milk and a vegetable pouch. The child was not given a second vegetable or a fruit. The second child had ravioli, grapes, yogurt and milk. A second fruit or a vegetable was not served. The third child had a peanut butter and jelly sandwich, blueberries, yogurt and milk. A second fruit or a vegetable was not served.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that one (1) child present in the facility did not have a written record on file that was completed and signed by the parent and retained by the facility on the first day of attendance. The facility was unable to produce information regarding the child's identifying information, date of birth, medical history, authorization for emergency medical care, parental contact, physician contact, pick-up authorization and preferred hospital.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the fire drill documentation did not contain evidence of a fire drill being completed during the month of February 2018. The staff person in charge stated that a fire drill was conducted on 2-21-18, but she failed to document it.
