General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file for an employee hired on 1-3-18 did not contain evidence of a high school diploma, GED or Commonwealth Childcare Credential.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (4) Prescription and nonprescription medication shall be administered to a child in care:
- (a)1. With a written request of the child's parent or the child's prescribing health professional; and
- 2. According to the directions or instructions on the medication's label; or
- (b) In accordance with KRS 311.646.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that a piece of notebook paper signed on 3-23-17 gave the facility permission to administer medication to an enrolled child. The paper did not contain the name of the medication, the dosage to be given, the dates the medication was to be given or the time the medication was to be given.

- (5) The child-care center shall keep a written record of the administration of medication, including:
- (a) Time of each dosage;
- (b) Date;
- (c) Amount;
- (d) Name of staff person giving the medication;
- (e) Name of the child; and
- (f) Name of the medication.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and interview, it was found that the medication administration log for a child who receives Amphetamine Salts (generic for Adderall) daily did not contain information regarding the name of the medication, the dosage of medication given or the name of the staff person administering the medication. The staff were found to be initialing the form after administering the medication.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the fire drill documentation did not contain evidence of a fire drill being conducted during the month of August 2017.
