90 - Children Supervised

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain adequate supervision in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed a staff member standing at the cafeteria door to supervise a child going to the restroom while also supervising the remainder of the children in her group who remained in the cafeteria; however, when the staff member who had been standing in the doorway alternated positions with another staff member, the staff member was not informed as to who or how many children were in the restroom and expected to return back to the cafeteria. As the surveyor was leaving the center at approximately 4:30 P.M., two (2) female children who had been observed in the cafeteria as enrolled children, were observed in the bathroom. As the surveyor turned around to notify a staff member about the female children, a male child was also in close fountain and returned to the group in the gym. The male child was observed passing a custodial closet containing multiple container of cleaning products, and was also in close proximity to an exit door located within feet of where the child was observed. Staff members in both the gym and the cafeteria were unaware the children had left their designated area. The amount of time the children were unsupervised is unknown.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, and observation, the child care center failed to maintain staffing ratios in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon entering into the gym, the staff in charge was asked how many children were in her care "at that moment". The staff in charge replied 51 children. An additional staff member stated "all" of the children were in her care; however, she was unsure how many children were in the gym at that time. The staff in charge was asked multiple times how many children were in care to which each time she replied 51. The maximum group size for a mixed age group with the youngest child aged 4 years is 28. Observation revealed 43 children were in attendance "at that moment".

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. A review of documentation failed to reveal evidence that a staff meeting had been conducted, managed and documented in writing. The documentation was not presented after multiple requests.



350 - Health, Safety, Comfort

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities. (1) A director shall:

(I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, and interview, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon entering into the program, the staff in charge stated there were 51 children in care. Multiple times the staff in charge was asked how many children to which she rerpeatedly stated 51. The surveyor requested the staff in charge to gather the children to get an accurate account. Due to the lack of authority, and chaos observed, the approximate time it took to gather the children for an accurate count was 15-20 minutes. The children failed to follow the directives given and were running and ignoring the authority of the staff. Observation revealed little to no control creating an unsafe environment for the 43 children who were in attendance at the time. Also when returning from the playground approximately 30 yards away, into the cafeteria, there was not a count taken to assure all children had remained in the group and returned to the cafeteria from each separate group of children. Additionally, a person entered the program to pick up a child. A staff member instructed another staff member to check the ID as she did not recognize the person. The staff member reviewed the person's ID, but failed to review the file to verify the person was a listed pick-up person.

- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain the employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of documentation revealed a staff member with a hire date of 12/15/14 failed to have negative results of a tuberculin test or a written statement from a health professional staing the individual is free of tuberculosis. Interview with the staff member indicated the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.

410 - Training

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½)

hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of documentation revealed that a staff member with a hire date of 10/05/15 failed to have documentation verifying 15 hours of cabinet approved training had been completed for the current year. A review of ECE-TRIS records failed to reveal the training hours also. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed an unsupervised child in the hallway having access to a custodial closet with an open door containing a multitude of cleaning products, which were accessible to the child.

b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;

2. Before and after eating or handling food;

3. After toileting or diaper change;

4. After handling animals;

5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and

6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and

(c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed children were allowed to use the restroom when requested; however, not all of the children went to the restroom. The children who did go to the restroom were observed entering back into the program without washing their hands prior to or following, eating a snack.

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's files in accordance with regulatory requirements. Of ten children's files which were reviewed, 9 of the files failed to contain a current immunization certificate. Two (2) children's files failed to contain information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's physician.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of documentation failed to reveal a current evacuation plan in the event of a fire, natural disaster or other threatening situation which may pose a health or safety hazard for a child. The plan submitted was dated 9/19/14.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of files failed to reveal written policies regarding staff policies, an organizational chart, and other procedures necessary to ensure implementation of KRS 199.898, 922 KAR2:120 and 922 KAR 2:280. Additionally, three (3) chain of command documentations reviewed failed to be consistent with the information listed.

(c) Daily attendance records documenting the arrival and departure time of each child, including records that are required in accordance with 922 KAR 2:160, Section 13, if a child receives services from the child-care center through the Child Care Assistance Program;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. The daily attendance records were incomplete as the staff in charge was not able to determine the number of children in care when referring to her attendance record.
