General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff in charge did not provide verification that the employee with a hire date of 01/25/2021 had a personnel file to include: Name, address, date of birth, and date of employment, proof of educational qualifications, child abuse and neglect check, criminal records check.

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation. On 02/23/2021, observation revealed there were three (3) staff members present. The staff in charge did not provide verification verifying that at least one (1) staff member was certified in CPR and First-Aid.

The employee was not observed working.
