Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor discovered rabbit feces located on the Astroturf of the big children's playground.

Staff reported that they do not know how the rabbit feces got on the playground because they do not have a rabbit; however, they would clean up the feces.

1250 - Emergency Regulation Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:400E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the temperature of the surveyor was not taken before the surveyor was permitted entry into the child care center. Based on interview, the staff stated that they have been screening individuals; however, they did not think of screening the surveyor upon entrance to the child care center.

This deficiency was cited due to the following E-Reg: 922 KAR 2:405E

Section 7: Screening and Illness Requirements: Children and adults shall be screened for fever and contagious symptoms upon entry into the child care center or family child care home each day and shall not be allowed to enter if displaying a contagious fever or symptom of COVID-19.
