(1) Child-care center staff:

(a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a: 1. High school diploma:

- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, there was one (1) staff person with a hire date of 11/2/17 who was still enrolled in high school when they were first employed. However, this staff person graduated from high school in May 2018. A review of this staff person's file found that there was not a high school diploma or other qualifying documentation to verify this person has graduated.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:

1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that a staff person hired 8/16/15 had the results of a T.B. skin test dated 8/6/15. This exceeds the two-year time frame for a T.B. test.

410 - Training

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and a review of ECE-TRIS records there were two (2) staff with hire dates of 11/2/17 and 2/8/18 who had not completed the required six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training. There was one (1) staff person with a hire date of 12/31/17 who took Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma Training 2/8/13. There was no documentation to verify this staff person had renewed this training. A staff person with a hire date of 11/5/14 only had evidence of having completed three (3) hours of training for the 2016-2017 training year. There was an additional staff person with a hire date of 3/2/15 who had not completed the required fifteen (15) hours of training for the 2017-2018 training year.

Programming

420 - Program of Activities Followed

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

(4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:

- (a) Posted in writing in a conspicuous location with each age group and followed;
- (b) Of activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served;
- (c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and
- (d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities including the following:
- 1. Art or music;
- 2. Math or numbers:
- 3. Dramatic play;
- 4. Stories and books;
- 5. Science or nature;
- 6. Block building or stacking;
- 7. Tactile or sensory activity;
- 8. Multi-cultural exposure;

9. Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles;

- 10. A balance of active and quiet play, including group and individual activity;
- 11. An opportunity for a child to:
- a. Have some free choice of activities;
- b. If desired, play apart from the group at times;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, in the school age room there was not a planned program of activities posted. The schedule posted was for a half day. There was no evidence of a full day schedule posted. An interview with staff in the room found that they were not the regular teachers in the room. They confirmed they did not know where the lesson plan was located but stated they had been doing activities with the children.

Premises Not In Compliance 580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements. (9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, during a tour of the facility the following was found: 1) In the purple room there were numerous areas of chipping and peeling paint on the walls that exposed the drywall beneath. 2) In the Blue Room there were areas of the wall where the bulletin board is located where the paint had chipped and peeled. There were also sections of the wall near the bathroom and the children's cubbies that had drywall exposed.

General: Based on Observation, in the bathroom located in the Purple Room feces and urine were observed in the toilet.

(a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:

1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section: 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;

3. An epinephrine auto-injector. In accordance with KRS 199.8951:

a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child:

b. A child-care center shall have at least one person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;

c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and

d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12 if an epinephrine autoinjector is administered to a child; or

4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;

(b) Kept in the original bottle; and

(c) Properly labeled.

(7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, in a locked closet in the office area there was a clear plastic container with a green lid that contained a bottle of Children's Motrin and a dispensing cup. The bottle of Motrin was not labeled for an individual child. In the same closet there was a bottle of Kroger brand Children's ibuprofen in a clear plastic baggy. The baggy contained a child's name and the bottle did not contain a child's name. There was also a bottle of Equate brand children's pain reliever stored in this same manner with only the the baggy labeled with a child's name. There was also a bottle of infants ibuprofen that was not labeled with a child's name and a bottle of Neomycin and Polymycin B Sulfate drops that was labeled with the letters SR. In an unlocked drawer in the office area where the first aid supplies were stored there were two (2) bottles of ibuprofen and one (1) bottle of acetaminophen that were not labeled for an indivdual and they were stored in an unlocked condition. Let it be noted that the office area is an open area located at the front of the facility.

Outdoor Play Area Not In Compliance 750 - Playground Conditions Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements. (20) An outdoor play area shall be: (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard: (e) Well drained: (f) Well maintained; (g) In good repair; and (h) Visible to staff at all times. Findings: General: Based on Observation, on the large playground used by the school age children and older preschool children a large metal basketball goal post with a clear backboard was observed lying face down in front of a section of the fence that runs along the back of the playground. The metal rim and net were on the ground beside the post. It appeared that the rim had broken off of the clear backboard **Not In Compliance** 755 - Protective Surface 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(21) A protective surface shall:

(a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:

- 1. Climb;
- 2. Swing; and

3. Slide; and

(b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, there was a long red, green and tan plastic climber on the playground located off of the Green Room and the Blue Room. These rooms have children ages one to two (1-2) years old. The climber with a slide was sitting on astroturf and the back of the structure was up against the fence.
