Findings: General: Based on interview with the owner it was revealed that children who were exposed to the Coronavirus from a staff member who tested positive were moved to other classrooms in the child care center; therefore, compromising the public health of all other children and staff members. Review of documentation from the health department revealed some of the parents of children exposed to the aforementioned staff member were not informed that the health department had recommended the children be quarantined.

922 KAR 2:400E. Emergency Regulation. Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.	
Findings: General: Interview with the owner revealed the following: 1. The child care center did not comply with the recommendation from the health department for children who had direct contact with a staff member who tested positive for the Coronavirus to be quarantined; 2. The child care center moved the exposed children to different classrooms continuing to care for them; therefore, possibly exposing additional children and staff members to the virus; 3. The child care center did not provide the health department with the requested information for the children and staff members who were exposed to the virus by the staff member who tested positive when requested.
