Review of the liability insurance presented for review at the time of survey revealed the policy is no longer current as it expired 7/1/17. Interview with director revealed a copy of the current policy could not be located at the time of

(14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

# Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files and ECE-TRIS report revealed documentation of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training was not presented for review at the time of survey for two (2) staff members hired 5/24/96 and 6/2/15. Continued review of staff files revealed one (1) staff member hired 8/31/15 had not received Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training PAHT. Review of staff files revealed two (2) staff members with a hire date of 8/31/15 and 3/24/17 had not completed state approved orientation training. Interview with director revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.

- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulations. Review of ten (10) children's files revealed the immunization certificate on file for a child enrolled 7/13/17 is not valid as it failed to include a validation date. Interview with director revealed the immunization certificate presented for review was the only certificate on file at the time of survey for the child enrolled 7/13/17.

- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and

- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;

## Findings:

1120 - Fire Drills

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulations. Review of ten (10) children's files revealed the written records for one (1) child enrolled 7/8/17 failed to contain contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's preferred hospital. Interview with director revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.

# Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulations. Review of the fire drill logs presented for review at the time of survey revealed a fire drill was not documented for November 2016. Interview with director revealed the drill was conducted; however, he could not locate this documentation at the time of survey.
