- (10) The minimum number of adult workers in a child-care center shall be sufficient to ensure that:
- (a) Minimum staff-to-child ratios in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120 are followed;
- (b) Each staff person under eighteen (18) years of age and each student trainee are under the direct supervision of a qualified staff person who meets the requirements of this section; and
- (c) Unless providing care with a qualified staff person, a person under the age of eighteen (18) shall not be counted as staff for the staff-to-child ratio.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Interview with the staff member in charge revealed 102 children are enrolled at the center. Observation of the cafeteria revealed sixty-six (66) children ages five (5) through eleven (11) years old were present at the time of the survey. Review of the staff schedule revealed only three (3) staff members were employeed at the center, therefore, the center failed to employee an adequate amount of staff members in order to ensure that minimum staff-to-child ratios could be followed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Observation of the cafeteria revealed the center was noncompliant with staff to child ratio regulations for the duration of the one (1) and one half (1/2) hour survey. Sixty-six (66) children were present, and separated into three (3) groups. A group of twenty-six (26) five (5) and six (6) year old children was supervised (1) by one staff member. For twenty (20) minutes, one (1) staff member supervised thirty-two (32) five (5) through eleven year old children. This exceeds the minimum staff to child ratio of one (1) staff member to fifteen (15) children, based on the age of the youngest child present.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the cafeteria revealed a doorbell rang for ten (10) minutes, and staff members did not repond to it. After ten (10) minutes, a child walked into the cafeteria and asked the stafff members, "Didn't you hear me ringing the doorbell?" Interview with the staff member in charge revealed the child was eleven (11) years old and enrolled to attend the center. The staff member in charge stated that the child is transported to the center via school bus. The center is located in an elementary school, and, per the staff member in charge, the school does not allow non-faculty members to answer the door. Later in the survey, two middle school-aged children were observed to exit a school bus, walk across a section of parking lot, and ring the doorbell for five (5) minutes. The three (3) aforementioned children were outside of the school building, and not within the scope of sight or sound of any adult for an excessive amount of time; therefore, their safety was compromised. Two (2) of the aforementioned children walked across a section of parking lot, outside of the scope of sight and sound of an adult; therefore, their safety was compromised.

Upon request, the staff member in charge did not present verification that the file for a staff member with a hire date of 10/30/18 contained a high school diploma, GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff member in charge did not present verification that the files for staff members with hire dates of 5/24/96 and 10/30/18 contained a current statement from a health professional that the individuals are free of active tuberculosis; or a copy of negative tuberculin results.

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of staff files revealed the center had only one (1) qualified substitue.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff member in charge did not present verification that the staff members with hire dates of 5/24/96 and 6/2/15 and had completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training within the past five (5) years. This was also cited in the 2018 renewal survey.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff member in charge did not present verification that the files for children with enrollment dates of 8/12/19, 8/15/19, and 8/26/19 contained the name of a family physician or a preferred hospital.
