General: Based on observation and interview, the family child care provider failed to comply with regulations specific to the current pandemic, as established in 922 KAR 2:400e. Per the referenced regulations, toddlers shall not share communal toys without the toys being cleaned between each child playing with them. Observation revealed two, two (2) year old children playing with several containers of communal play doh. Additionally foam puzzle pieces were observed covering the floor.

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the family child care provider failed to maintain provider records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of the provider's file and a review of ECE-TRIS failed to reveal verification of completing PAHT training. Interview with the provider revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the visit.
