General: Based on observation, three (3) electrical outlets did not contain a safety cover in the eating area. One (1) electrical outlet did not contain a safety plug in the upstairs preschool room. The strings to the window blinds hung down accessible to the children in the two-year-olds' room. The pencli sharpner cord hung down onto the floor in the upstairs preschool room.

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a caregiver hired 01/16/17, completed orientation training on 06/01/17, and a caregiver hired 06/13/16, completed orientation training on 10/13/16; therefore, these two (2) caregivers each did not complete orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment. A caregiver hired 08/14/13, completed eight (8) hours of annual training. A caregiver hired 02/19/02, completed twelve (12) hours of annual training.

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, a child, date of birth 05/20/15, was combined with the toddler children, all day, each day in the toddlers' room

Findings

General: Based on observation and interview, an air freshner bottle was plugged into the wall in the two-year-olds' room and an air freshner bottle was plugged into the power strip which laid on the floor in the preschool room. These items were accessble to the children. The air freshner bottle packaging indicated, "Keep out of reach of children".

520 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a large brown dark stain was on the floor in the hallway at the entrance to the upstairs preschool room.

585 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the hot water did not turn on at the handwashing sink in the preschool rooms. Interview and observation determined there were additional handwashing sinks located across from the preschool rooms but the sinks were labeled for "snack and lunch time use only".

Findings:

General: Based on observation, sixteen (16) children, one-year-old through three-years-old, sat directly on the floor and did not wash their hands before they ate lunch. One (1), two-year-old child and two (2) mobile toddler children did not wash their hands after they were diapered.

General: Based on observation, the toddlers' caregiver wores gloves but did not wash her hands before she diapered a toddler child. A toddlers' caregiver did not wash her hands before she fed two (2) toddler children their morning snack. A toddlers' caregiver used a wipe to clean spit up off of a toddler child but the caregiver did not wash her hands after.

A bottle of amoxicillin was in an unlocked medicine box in the kitchen refrigerator. A tube of Cortizone cream was stored in an unlocked medicine box in the upstairs preschool room.
