In addition, four (4) chain links and the metal parts of the swing seat had rust on the older children's outdoor playground. Also, a door to a toilet stall was off the hinge in the restroom located across from the kitchen.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, nine (9) children were present in the two-year-olds' room, but only six (6) children had a documented arrival time. Six (6) children were present in the older two-year-olds' room, but only four (4) children had a documented arrival time. Twelve (12) children were present in the preschool room, but only eight (8) children had a documented arrival time. Four (4) children were present in the one-year-olds' room, but only two (2) children had a documented arrival time.
