A caregiver hired 6/17/21, did not complete one and a half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training (PHAT) within the first year of employment.

- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a child enrolled 8/19/18, did not have written permission for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence.
