General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements with regard to liability insurance. Upon request, the director failed to provide documented evidence of liability insurance coverage of at least \$100,000 per occurrence.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements with regard to the operation instruction/regulation copy. Upon request, the director failed to provide documented evidence that each staff person at the child care center were instructed on the current administrative regulations. Review of the administrative regulations presented were dated 10/08/15.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records for staff with a hire date of 09/11/18. Upon request, the director failed to provide documented evidence from a medical professional that the staff is free of active tuberculosis.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2)

hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records for staff with hire dates 12/12/16, 09/11/18, and 03/01/17. Upon request, the director failed to provide documented evidence of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed during each subsequent year of employment.

Programming

455 - Discipline

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.
(10) A child shall not be subjected to:

(a) Corporal physical discipline pursuant to KRS 199.896(18);
(b) Loud, profane, threatening, frightening, humiliating, or abusive language; or
(c) Discipline that is associated with:

Rest;
Toileting; or
Food.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements with regard to discipline. Observation of the Toddler and Preschool classrooms revealed staff who used loud, aggressive and threatening language when speaking to the children in care. Staff in Preschool classroom were observed to state "Lay

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain premises in accordance with regulatory requirements, i.e. the wall of the Toddler classroom revealed missing wall border.

650 - Toilet

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(4) Each toilet shall:

(a) Be kept in clean condition;

- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the toilet room in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon inspection of the School-age Boys toilet room, it was discovered that one (1) of two (2) toilets in the room were unclean. The toilet was unflushed and contained a large amount of toilet paper and stool. **Hygienic Practices**

680 - Soiled Diapers/Clothing

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(8) Diapers or clothing shall be:

(a) Changed when soiled or wet:

- (b) Stored in a covered container temporarily; and
- (c) Washed or disposed of at least once a day.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory hygienic requirements. Upon inspection of the One-Year-Old's classroom and outside the door of the Preschool's classroom, it was revealed that soiled diapers were stored in uncovered containers.

685 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(10) When a child is diapered, the child shall:

- (b) Be placed on a surface that is:
- 1. Clean:
- 2. Padded;
- 3. Free of holes, rips, tears, or other damage;
- 4. Nonabsorbent:
- 5. Easily cleaned; and
- 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory hygienic requirements as it related to the diaper changing area/surface. Observation of the One-Year-Old's classroom revealed rips and tears in the diaper changing mat. The diaper changing area was also observed with disinfectant spray on the mat and in accessible reach of a child when receiving a diaper change. **First Aid/Medication**

Not In Compliance **Outdoor Play Area** 750 - Playground Conditions Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements. (20) An outdoor play area shall be: (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard; (e) Well drained; (f) Well maintained: (g) In good repair; and (h) Visible to staff at all times. Findings: General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon inspection of the outdoor play area, it was discovered that areas of the playground had exposed black plastic from underneath the protective surface material. The plastic was presented as a foreseeable tripping hazard. In addition, railroad track wooden blocks protruded from the ground and also presented trip hazards in areas of play. Equipment Not In Compliance 820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings. (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall: (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair; (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups; (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and

(d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain outdoor equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the outdoor play area revealed a blue see-saw with rusty parts. In addition, a stationary bike peddler toy had two (2) broken seats with sharp edges. Further observation revealed a multi-colored climbing apparatus, stationed in close proximity to the fence, presenting an entrapment hazard, as well as, a large gap between the ground and fencing, also presenting an entrapment hazard.
