Findings:

435 - Training

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1. Staff members hired 7/26/2021, 10/2/21, 9/13/21, 10/28/21 did not complete fifteen hours of early care and education training for the July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021 training year. These individuals have an active TRIS record.
- 2. A staff member hired 1/25/2000, had a Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training that exceeded five years; the training was last taken on 7/26/2016. A review of ECE-TRIS supports these findings.

Findings

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. Room 241 (Mini Gym) contained four holes in the drywall around the thermostat. It appeared that a box may have been removed from the wall around the thermostat.
- 2. Room 239 (Preschool 2) contained tape residue on the floor in front of the carpet near the back of the room.
- 3. Room 240 (Preschool 1) contained an area of tape residue on the cinderblock wall below the window.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. Room 239 (Preschool 2) contained tape residue on the top of a shelving unit that was storing pretend foods and dishes.
- 2. Room 239 (Preschool 2) contained a mirror in the home-living area that was scuffed and scratched on the surface.
- 3. Room 239 (Preschool 2) contained tape residue on a shelf that was storing blocks.
- 4. Room 225 (Toddler 2-B) contained tape residue on a wooden shelf that contained doll houses.

865 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The Nursery 2 Room contained an unclean safety latch on the diaper changing cabinet. The latch on the cabinet contained a hairball.
- 2. The small playground contained two metal frogs that the children talk into that were in disrepair. The frogs contained chipped paint and rust in the area that the children speak into.

General: Based on review of documentation, one child did not have a preferred hospital listed in their enrollment information. This child was enrolled 8/01/2021.
