(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 1⁄2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found that a staff (DOH: 11/09/10) obtained only fourteen (14) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training from 11/09/2015 through 11/08/2016.
