922 KAR 2:100 - Section 15. Medication and First Aid.

- (1) Medication, including medicine that requires refrigeration, shall be stored in a locked container or area with a lock unless the medication is:
- (a) A first aid supply. A first aid supply shall be maintained in accordance with subsection (4) of this section;
- (b) Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child in care;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, all personal medications belonging to the provider are stored in an unlocked cabinet over the sink in the kitchen. Some of the medications were stored in an unlocked, clear, plastic container while others were loose inside the cabient.

500 - Medication administration 922 KAR 2:100 - Section 15. Medication and First Aid.

- (2) Prescription and nonprescription medication shall be administered to a child in care:
- (a) With a written request of the child's parent or the child's prescribing health professional; or
- (b) In accordance with KRS 311.646.
- (3) Prescription and nonprescription medications shall be:
- (a) Labeled; and
- (b) Administered according to directions or instructions on the label.

Findings

General: Based on observation and interview, there were tubes of diaper cream in a locked box on a shelf under the diaper changing table. These tubes of diaper ointment were not labeled for an individual child. An interview with the staff person in charge found that there are no children enrolled who are currently using the diaper ointment.

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, it was found that the document provided at the time of the survey contained a date and a time, but the type of drill that was conducted on this date and time was not documented. An interview with the provider found that the all drills including the fire drill are conducted on the the same day and at the same time and documented in that manner. When documenting monthly fire drills, the type of drill, date, and time the drill was conducted should be documented as a seperate drill from all other required drills.

770 - Earthquake Drill and Tornado Drill Requirements

An interview with the provider found that the all drills, including quarterly earthquake and tornado drills, are conducted on the same date and at the same time. When documenting monthly earthquake and tornado drills, the type of drill, date, and time the drill was conducted should be documented as a seperate drill from all other required drills.
