Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed a 2005 Ford van, VIN # 1FBSS31S15Ha58636, transported nine (9) to ten (10) children from school to the center, driven by an owner of the center. A complete interior and exterior inspection of the van was conducted. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the center provides daily afternoon transportation to the center from a near-by school. Documentation revealed logs of children for whom the transportation is provided. Further documentation revealed transportation policies and procedures, including inspections, insurance, active driver's licenses, and Kentucky state transportation records. Per review of DRCC records, the center is not approved for transportation. Therefore, they were providing transportation prior to submitting a written request to DRCC to approve transportation service and allowing time for approval before implementation of the service.

General: Based on observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with the comfort of a child. Upon entering into the building, school-aged children were observed to be lying directly onto a bare, concrete floor, wrapped in blankets, watching a video.

General: Based on review of documentation, interview, and observation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of documentation failed to reveal completed CAN results for a staff member with a hire date of 03/27/17. Interview with staff in charge revealed the results were maintained at another location. The results were not available at the time of the survey. The staff member was not observed working alone at the time of the survey.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed toys to be be in disrepair; specifically, a doll's body was observed, which failed to include a doll's head. Additionally, several dolls which were observed failed to be dressed, or have clothing available to dress the doll in.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding transportation. Based on a review of documentation, records failed to reveal monthly emergency procedure drills. Interview with staff in charge revealed she was unaware that drills needed to be performed.

Upon entry into the center, the staff in charge stated she had served pizza, fruit, and Sprite for lunch. Continued interview revealed the fruit served was bananas, but upon further interview, the staff in charge recanted the statement that a fruit had been served with lunch. Interview also revealed that Sprite, and not milk, had been served with the pizza for lunch.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of documentation revealed a file for a child enrolled on 06/03/16 failed to have contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's physician.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Based on interview, a staff member refused access of transportation documentation to the surveyor when requested. The surveyor had requested the number of children transported on the run made at the time of the inspection. The staff member stated there were ten (10) children transported. When asked where the children were seated on the van, the staff member stated a child had ridden in the front seat. The staff member then recursted statements regarding whether there were nine (9) or ten (10) children transported, and where they had been seated in the van. The staff member then refused access to the transportation log, when requested multiple times by the surveyor.
