No other documentation was presented.

In the outside playground, the cushions being used as protective surface for a climbing station absorbed water, causing what appeared to be mildew and green mold to form on the cushions.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the family child care home failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulations. The names of the children who participated in the fire drills from January 2017 – May 2018 were not presented for review at the time of survey. In addition, the provider acknowledged that the names of the children were not documented for these drills.

770 - Earthquake Drill and Tornado Drill Requirements

- (19) An earthquake drill and a tornado drill shall be conducted during hours of operation:

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the family child care home failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulations. The names of the children who participated in the earthquake and tornado drills from the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th quarters of 2017 as well as the 1st quarter of 2018 were not presented for review at the time of survey. In addition, the provider acknowledged that the names of the children were not documented for these earthquake and tornado drills.
