Review of presented documentation revealed the child care center did not present current liability insurance at the time of the survey. Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was unable to locate the documentation at the time of the survey.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Review of presented staff files revealed the child care center did not have staff evaluations on file for two (2) staff members with the hire date 12/1/10. Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was unable to locate the documents at the time of the survey.



265 - Health, Safety, Comfort

922 KAR 2:110. Section 4. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the two-year-old room revealed a staff member grabbed a little boy by one arm and lifted him out of the chair he was sitting in. The child made a face as if in pain while the staff member had the child suspended in the air by one arm.

270 - Parent Notification In Compliance

- (m) Notify the parent immediately of an accident or incident requiring medical treatment of a child;

General: Based on Observation, review of documentation and interview, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the infant room revealed a staff member with hired 7/19/16 was the sole caregiver of three (3) children. Continued observation revealed a staff member that was standing in the science room to enter the infant room with the aforementioned staff member. Review of presented staff files revealed the staff member hired 7/19/16 did not have a child abuse and neglect (CAN) check on file for review at the time of the survey. Interview with staff in charge revealed the CAN was not on file for the staff member hired 7/19/16 that was the sole caregiver in the infant room with the children.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, review of documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the infant room revealed a staff member with hired 7/19/16 to be the sole caregiver of three (3) children. Continued observation revealed a staff member that was standing in the science room to enter the infant room with the aforementioned staff member. Review of presented staff files revealed the staff member hired 7/19/16 did not have a child abuse and neglect (CAN) check on file for review at the time of the survey. Interview with staff in charge revealed the CAN was not on file for the staff member hired 7/19/16 that was alone in the infant room.

Review of staff files revealed a criminal records check not submitted by the end of the first day of employment for staff members with the hire dates; 6/20/16, 7/5/16, 2/25/16 and 5/26/16. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the staff members never worked alone with children until the criminal record check was completed.

- (f) An individual who has been convicted of, or has entered an Alford plea or a plea of guilty to, an offense under a criminal statute of the United States or of another state similar to an offense specified in this subsection.
- (7) An individual who has been convicted of, or entered an Alford plea or a plea of guilty to, a nonviolent felony or misdemeanor not specified in this section shall be handled on a case-by-case basis by the licensee with consideration given to the:
 - (a) Nature of the offense;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of presented staff files revealed a criminal record check dated 5/9/16 for a staff hired 5/9/16. Continued review of the criminal record check revealed a felony drug charge with the original case filed on 12/30/12 in Jefferson County for the staff hired 5/9/16. Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was not aware of the felony drug charge on the criminal records. Continued interview with the staff in charge revealed she was unable to provide documentation that the charge was not a felony.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and Interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of presented staff files revealed a staff hired 7/19/16 did not have a high school diploma, GED or Commonwealth Child Care Credential on file at the time of the survey. Interview with staff in charge revealed she was unable to locate the document at the time of the survey.



320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

Review of presented staff files revealed three (3) staff members with the hire dates; 4/28/14, 5/9/16 and 7/19/16 did not have written documentation from a health care professional to verify that the individual was free from active TB at the time of the survey. Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was unable to locate the documentation at the time of the survey.

Interview with the director revealed she was unable to locate the documents at the time of the survey.
