- (1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.
- (2) A child care staff member hired on or after January 1, 2018, shall:
- (a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or
- (b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;
- 2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation; and
- 3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disqualifying background check result.

Findings

General: Based on review of documentation, interview, and observation, the child care center failed to maintain background checks in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of staff files revealed that a staff member with a hire date of 8/7/18, failed to submit and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation, prior to becoming a child care center staff member. The aforementioned staff member was observed working alone and/or with an unqualified staff member. Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was aware that fingerprints had not been submitted as of the date of the survey. A staff member with a hire date of 8/8/18 was observed working alone, or with the unqualified aforementioned staff member, without documentation of her eligibility being contained in the file.

A review of documentation failed to reveal written proof of liability insurance coverage of at least \$100,000 per occurrence. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.

- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of staff files failed to reveal negative tuberculin test results or a written statement from a health care professional stating the staff member with a hire date of 8/8/18, is free of tuberculosis. Further review revealed the test had been administered; however results had not been obtained at the time of the survey. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of staff files revealed that a staff member with a hire date of 9/1/97 failed to have documentation of 15 hours of cabinet-approved early child care training. A review of ECE-TRIS also failed to reveal the required 15 hours of training. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation failed to reveal handwashing after eating snack for fifty-five (55) school age children before returning to scheduled activities.

- (20) An outdoor play area shall be:(d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;
- (e) Well drained;
- (f) Well maintained;
- (g) In good repair; and
- (h) Visible to staff at all times.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. There was an excessive amount of grass and weeds under the slides and eight (8) swings.

755 - Protective Surface Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (21) A protective surface shall:
- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb;
- 2. Swing; and
- 3. Slide; and
- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. There was a lack of ground covering under eight (8) swings, revealing an excessive amount of grass protruding through the less than minimal ground covering.

- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. There was a small split in the middle of the red, smaller sliding board on the large climbing structure, leaving it in disrepair.
