The director stated a review of the security cameras found at approximately 2:02 p.m., the children in the blue and orange groups and two (2) staff enter the building after leaving the playground. She stated a review of the security cameras found at approximately 2:19 p.m., a staff person who was returning from lunch enter the building with the five-year-old child walking next to her. She stated the child was supposed to be with the children in the blue group. She stated that she spoke to the child's teacher who admitted that he did not check his group list prior to entering the building. She stated the staff person was terminated that day for violating safety policies. The staff person who found the child stated she returned from lunch at approximately 2:07 p.m. and parked her car facing the playground. She stated that she noticed the child standing next to the gate crying. She stated, "She was crying and pretty hysterical." She stated once the child saw her, she calmed down and stopped crying. An interview conducted on 12/3/18 with the staff person who had been responsible for the child indicated that the child must have gotten out of line at some point and hid. He admitted that he did not realize she had been left on the playground.
