# Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was determined this regulatory requirement was not met. During a walkthrough of the Dove Room, the surveyor observed a 16 ounce can of Monster Energy Drink on the counter top near the sink area. The drink was in reach of children and easily accessible. The children in the room at the time were four (4) and five (5) years of age. The teacher in the room stated the drink did belong to her.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

# Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was determined this regulatory requirement was not met. During a walkthrough of the bathroom near the Robin room, the surveyor observed a ceiling tile was missing over the sink area. Staff stated the area had received water damage and the tile had not been replaced.

The surveyor noted the mat was torn and a piece of tape on the underside of the mat was extremely dirty.

- 3. During a walkthrough of the Hummingbird Room, the surveyor observed the lesson plan posted to be outdated. The lesson plan posted was for the week of 4/15/2019 to 4/19/2019.
