General: Based on review of documentation, one staff hired on 6/15/20, did not have documentation of negative TB results on file at the facility. The documentation on file expired on 5/19/21.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, two staff hired on 1/10/18, and 03/24/21, did not complete the required CPR/FA training. A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed this finding.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1.) Two staff hired on 6/15/20, did not take the Orientation training within three months of employment. The courses were taken on 4/7/21, and 5/7/21.
- 2.) Two staff hired on 8/12/14, and 1/10/18, did not complete the required 15 hours of training for the 20-21 year.

A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed these findings.

General: Based on observation, there was water damage to a ceiling tile in the Cardinal Room 104.
