General: Based on observation, there is a large open grass space between the back of the facility and where the fenced-in playground starts. This open green space is not completely fenced-in and the back of an existing house sits partially in that space. The part of the green space that is not fenced in leads out to a street. DRCC surveyor noted that in that open green space was a basketball goal attached to the side of the facility building. The staff person in charge stated that the children do use the grass space to play basketball and to run around. This open space has not been approved by the cabinet.

General: Based on observation, there was a plastic bottle and several pieces of paper found on the playground.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a house was located on the open grass space the children have been using to play basketball and run around. Staff person in charge stated that no one is currently living in the home. It was noted that at the back of the house there were overgrown weeds, a wood pallette on the ground, an HVAC system, a metal bar, sections of carpet, broken pieces of wood and a set of stairs leading up to the house all accessible to the children. This grass space had not been approved by the Cabinet.

General: Based on observation, there was an observation sheet posted in each classroom which stated, "Morning Health Checks". Each sheet had an area to list a childs name and next to the name were the words, "Eyes, ears, nose, mouth, skin, swelling/bruises, coughing/sneezing, breathing difficulty, sores/spots/rashes, itchy head, unusual behavior and low activity level". The observation sheet also stated to put an X in the box indicating the areas of concern, then notify parent and document. It also stated to put a check mark in the box indicating the areas without visible concerns. This information was accessible to any person who entered the classroom.
