(b) Provided with a copy of this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care center director did not present verification of a current copy of the administrative regulations.

345 - Staff Evaluation

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.
(1) A director shall:

(j) Assess each staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance through an annual written performance evaluation;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification of the evaluations assessing the staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance for fourteen (14) of the seventeen (17) employees eligible.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not provide verification that the employee with the hire date of 08/12/2017 had a personnel file to include: Name, address, date of birth, and date of employment, proof of educational qualifications, Tb test results, child abuse and neglect check, and criminal records check.

390 - Educational Requirements

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the record for the employee with the hire date of 08/12/2017 contained a copy of a High school diploma: or a GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.

Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the record for the employee with the hire date of 08/12/2017 contained a current copy of a statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or a copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings: General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that at least one (1) staff member was certified in CPR and First Aid. 410 - Training Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements. (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment; (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years. Findings: General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the record of the employees with the hire dates of 11/01/2010, 03/05/2013, 11/17/2014, 03/11/2015 and 10/07/2016 had met the requirement of Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment. Continued review revealed that the two (2) employees with the hire date of 11/01/2010 had not met the requirement of updating their pediatric abusive head trauma training. Review of the TRIS training system indicated the above-mentioned employees had not met the requirement. If desired, play apart from the group at times; Findings: General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Upon request, the center director did not present for review verification that the daily activity of programming that was posted in writing that had been updated to reflect the current week in the "Monkey" infant classroom. - (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the records for the children with the enrollment dates of 09/03/2014 and 10/19/2015 contained information listing a name of a preferred hospital.

Upon request, the child care director did not provide verification that a posting of the information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program was in a conspicuous place and was made available for public inspection.
