General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain a staff member on duty who is certified in CPR and first aid. Two (2) staff members, both hired 2/4/11, had CPR and first aid training that had expired 2/17/19 and 8/25/19. A third staff member did not have evidence of CPR/First aid training.
