General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found a staff's (DOH: 01/27/17) file contained a Child Abuse and Neglect background check indicating that the individual had previously lived in Virginia and Florida. Through interview with the Director, the surveyor learned that the individual has lived in Virginia and Florida within the past five (5) years. Additionally, out-of-state criminal records background checks were not completed and the individual has been alone with the children.

Findings:

General: Based on observation upon arrival to the center, the surveyor found that seventeen (17) preschool-age children and two (2) staff were returning from a field trip to the local pool. Through review of documentation, the surveyor found that neither staff that went on the field trip had first aid or CPR training.

- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that two (2) empty plastic bags were stored in a child's cubby. The empty plastic bags were within reach of the children.
