General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A substitute staff hired on 10/29/2021, did not have written evidence of completing CPR/First Aid training. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed and confirmed this finding.

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A substitute staff member hired on 10/29/2021, did not complete the required Orientation. This staff member has been employed for more than three months. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed and confirmed this finding.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The Preschool/School-Age Room contained a bottle of Febreze Air freshener and a bottle of Sanitize Those Hands hand sanitizer. These bottles were labeled "Keep Out of Reach of a Child" and were located on the bottom shelf of a shelving unit, within reach of a child.

#### 585 - Premises Requirements

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A faucet, (located on the lower part of the wall) in the women's hall bathroom, was missing the metal plate cover that goes around the valve in the wall. The faucet was located on the wall adjacent to the hand washing sinks. The plate cover was observed on the floor below the faucet.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The overhead florescent lights in the Infant Room were very dim, causing the Infant Room to be poorly lit.

## Findings:
