## Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. During a tour of Room #103 (school age classroom), the surveyor observed a staff purse and a container of Clorox Disinfecting wipes sitting on the counter beside the entrance/exit door of the room. These items were accessible to the children.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

#### **Findings**

General: Based on review of documentation, one child (enrollment date: 7/12/19) had an immunization certificate on file that was no longer current as of 7/28/20.

- (1) A director shall:
- (h) Post a schedule of daily activities, to include dates and times of activities to be conducted with the children in each classroom;

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. Room #202 (two-year-old classroom) had a schedule of daily activities posted that was dated March 9 13, 2020; therefore, it was no longer current.
- 2. Room #103 (school age classroom) had a schedule of daily activities posted that was dated "September"; therefore, it was not current.

# 1250 - Emergency Regulation

922 KAR 2:400E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. 922 KAR 2:400E, section 7(1) states, "Each adult, including parents and guardians at drop-off and pick-up, shall wear a face mask while inside a child care center or family child care home..." During a tour of the facility, the surveyor noted that the staff person working in Room #202 was not wearing a mask or any type of face covering. This situation was discussed with the staff person in charge during the visit. The staff person in charge stated that she was not aware of the situation and immediately went to talk to the staff person. The staff person in charge later informed the surveyor that the staff person stated that she "accidentally left her mask at home". The staff person in charge then provided a mask for the staff person to wear.
