922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

# Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulation was not met. There was a container of disinfecting wipes in the Sunshine room on a low shelf accessible to children. They are marked keep out of reach of children. In addition, there was two bottles of hand sanitizer in room 36 and one in room 34 which were accessible to children.

# 625 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulation was not met. There were four stained ceiling tiles in the Sunshine Room.

- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon his or her developmental skills;
- (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulation was not met. The following was found:

- 1.) Children did not wash their hands when they came inside from the playground.
- 2.) Children bring their lunches from home. A staff was opening/preparing their lunches for them in room 32. She would touch/open each lunch box, open each food item (touching the item, such as a sandwich or banana) and placing them on the table. The staff was not wearing gloves and did not wash her hands between each child's food.
