(8) To qualify for a preliminary license, or maintain a regular license, a child-care center shall: (b) Be approved by the Office of the State Fire Marshal or designee; Findings: General: Based on interview, the surveyor found a fire marshal report was not available for review during the surveyor's visit. Staff-in-charge presented the surveyor with emails that were sent to the fire marshal on 9/13/2021 and 9/29/2021. The emails were requesting that the fire marshal conduct a visit. Staff-in-charge stated the fire marshal did not conduct a visit at the child-care center after the emails were sent to him. Therefore, the child-care center failed to provide documentation that the child-care center is in compliance. (8) Each center shall ensure that every staff member has received training on first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). Findings: General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor discovered a staff (DOH: 10/07/2011) had not obtained training on first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). A date was not entered into TRIS to verify that the staff had obtained the training. The staff's file did not contain documentation showing that the staff had completed the training; therefore, the child-care center failed to ensure the requirement that every staff member will obtain training on first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). Staff-in-charge thought the staff had completed the training; however, she was unable to provide the documentation to verify during the surveyor's visit.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

(17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor discovered the following:

1. Upon review of ECE-TRIS for the timeframe of 7/1/21 thru 6/30/22, one (1) staff (DOH: 10/7/2011) completed fourteen (14) hours of the fifteen (15) required hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training.

2. Upon review of ECE-TRIS for the timeframe of 7/1/21 thru 6/30/22, one (1) staff (DOH: 10/7/2011) completed zero (0) of the fifteen (15) required hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training.

3. Upon review of ECE-TRIS for the timeframe of 7/1/21 thru 6/30/22, one (1) staff (DOH: 9/13/2018) completed thirteen (13) hours of the fifteen (15) required hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training.

4. Upon review of ECE-TRIS for the timeframe of 7/1/21 thru 6/30/22, one (1) staff (DOH: 3/26/2012) completed seven and one-half (7.5) hours of the fifteen (15) required hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training.

5. Upon review of ECE-TRIS, one (1) staff (DOH: 10/7/2011) completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 8/17/2017; therefore, the pediatric abusive head trauma training was not completed every five years as required. Staff-in-charge stated that pediatric abusive head trauma has not been completed by the staff since 8/17/2017.

6. Upon review of ECE-TRIS, one (1) staff (DOH: 3/26/2012) completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 5/3/2016; therefore, the pediatric abusive head trauma training was not completed every five years as required. Staff-in-charge stated that pediatric abusive head trauma has not been completed by the staff since 5/3/2016.

Therefore, the child-care center failed to ensure that training was completed as required.

Staff-in-charge stated she would contact Child Care Aware and obtain a copy to post. Thus, the child-care center failed to post information on Children and Parent Rights as required.
