- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff in charge did not provide verification that the employees with the hire dates of 09/05/2020 and 10/25/2021 had met the requirement of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during the last year of employment. Review of documentation in the ECE-TRIS training system revealed the staff members listed above had not met the requirements.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff in charge did not present verification that the daily activity of programming was posted in writing that had been updated to reflect the current week that included the activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for five (5) of the five (5) classrooms.

500 - Electronic Viewing/Listening Planned Program

(1) Screen time, electronic viewing and listening devices shall only be used in the center as a part of the child's planned program of activity as established in Section 2(4) and (5) of this administrative regulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation in the two-year-old classroom, the television was playing a cartoon program. Interview with staff revealed the program was not part of a planned program for the toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation in the infant room, an infant was sleeping in their crib with a blanket. Further observation revealed another infant was sleeping in the crib with a bib attached to their neck.
