Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

1. A pink bucket that contained some soapy water and a white rag placed on top of a small black shelf in Classroom 116. Through interview with staff, the surveyor learned that the bucket contained soapy water.

2. A toilet brush was placed beside the toilet in the restroom in Classroom 111.

3. An unsecured white cord coming down from a wall ledge inside the restroom in Classroom 110. The cord was observed to be accessible to the children.

4. A mop was observed to be placed beside the sink in the restroom in Classroom 109.

The items mentioned were observed to be accessible to the children.

400 - Educational Requirements

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a: 1. High school diploma:

2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or

3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

1. A staff's (DOH: 03/17/22) file did not contain verification of a High School Diploma, GED or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.

2. A staff's (DOH: 08/17/22) file did not contain verification of a High School Diploma, GED or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.

405 - TB Verification

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:

1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that the following staff (DOH: 08/25/22, 09/15/22, and 08/17/22) files did not contain documentation of a current TB skin test or a statement from a health professional stating that the adult was free from active tuberculosis. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the staff mentioned did not have an up-to-date TB skin test.

435 - Training

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

(17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

1. A staff's (DOH: 11/18/19) obtained ten (10) hours of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training for the review period 07/01/2021 -06/30/2022

2. A staff's (DOH: 12/14/21) file did not contain documentation of six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training; therefore, the training was not completed within the first three (3) months of employment.

3. A staff (DOH: 10/05/16) completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 10/10/17; therefore, the training was not completed within the last five (5) years.

4. A staff (DOH: 09/25/17) completed one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 08/23/17; therefore, the training was not completed within the last five (5) years.

5. A staff (DOH: 10/01/21) obtained six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training on 01/17/22; therefore, the training was not completed within the first three (3) months of employment.

6. A staff (DOH: 08/19/21) obtained six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training on 10/23/22; therefore, the training was not completed within the first three (3) months of employment

7. A staff (DOH: 08/19/21) completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 10/23/22; therefore, the training was not completed within one (1) year of employment. Programming

(3) Rest time shall occur in an adequate space according to the child's age as follows:

(a) For an infant:

3. No bedding other than a clean tight-fitted sheet; and

4. No toys or other items except the infant's pacifier;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a loose blanket placed on a child asleep in a crib in Classroom 127. The surveyor observed a pacifier clip attached to the child's clothing. The child was observed laying on what appeared to be a giraffe baby mat. During interview, staff stated that the child was approximately nine-months-old and had been asleep for a few minutes. The child was observed to wake up within approximately one (1) minute of the surveyor entering the classroom.

625 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that a piece of black trim placed at the bottom of the wall in the restroom in Classroom 111 was no longer attached; therefore, the wall/trim was not in good repair.

695 - Toilet

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements. (4) Each toilet shall: (a) Be kept in clean condition; (b) Be kept in good repair; (c) Be in a lighted room; and (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that the toilet seat moved easily and was not tightly secured to the toilet in the restroom located in Classroom 109; therefore, the toilet was not kept in good repair. **Hygienic Practices**

730 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements. (10) When a child is diapered, the child shall: (b) Be placed on a surface that is: 1. Clean; 2. Padded; 3. Free of holes, rips, tears, or other damage;

- 4. Nonabsorbent;
- 5. Easily cleaned; and

6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

Findings:

1. Debris on the diaper changing table underneath the diaper changing pad in the restroom located in Classroom 110; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.

2. Debris on the diaper changing table underneath the diaper changing pad in the restroom located in Classroom 111; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.

3. Debris on the diaper changing table underneath the diaper changing pad in Classroom 127; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.

4. Debris on the diaper changing table underneath the diaper changing pad in the girls' restroom; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.
