During interview with a staff, the surveyor was informed that the center's insurance is current; however, verification was not presented during the renewal survey.

Findings

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A plunger was stored beside the commode located in the girls' restroom located in the lower building.
- 2. An extension cord dangled from an approximately twelve (12) foot wall and onto the floor in the dining area. The staff-in-charge identified that children, whose ages ranged from one to three-years-old, eat lunch in this area. The extension cord was within reach and accessible to the children.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. Sanitizing hand wipes were on the sink located in the classroom for the three and four-year-old children. The wipes label indicated the wipes should be kept out of the reach of children. The wipes were within reach and accessible to the children.
- 2. Sanitizing hand wipes and a staff's purse were on the desk located in the classroom for the four-year-old children. The items were within reach and accessible to the children.
- 3. A can of Zenatize Disinfectant Spray was on the bottom shelf of a metal cart located in the dining area. The disinfectant was within reach and accessible to the children.
- 4. Two bottles of hand sanitizer were sticking out of a side pocket located on a diaper bag. The diaper bag was located in the hallway that children walk through to the dining area. The hand sanitizer was within reach and accessible to the children.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A child's (DOE: 8/26/18) enrollment file contained an immunization certificate that was no longer current as of 1/16/19.
- 2. Three (3) of the children's (DOE: 8/26/18) enrollment files contained immunization certificates that had no expiration date. The children's immunization status could not be determined.
- 3. A child's (DOE: 6/8/16) enrollment file contained an immunization certificate that had no expiration date. The child's immunization status could not be determined.
- 4. A child's (DOE: 6/20/16) enrollment file contained an immunization certificate that had no expiration date. The child's immunization status could not be determined.

- 1. The surveyor found that only one (1) time of day and date were recorded for both, tornado and earthquake drills, for the first, second, third and fourth quarters of 2018.
- 2. The surveyor found that the day was not recorded on which the staff and children practiced the July 2018 fire drill.
