#### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that an allergy alert for two (2) children was posted on the wall in the Four Year Old classroom. The facility did not have written permission from the childrens' parents to post this information.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that a toilet brush was present in the bathroom used by the children. This brush was accessible to the children. It was also found that there were two (2) uncovered electrical outlets near the computer center in the Four Year Old classroom.

## Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the files for seven (7) employees did not contain evidence of a high school diploma, GED or Commonwealth Childcare Credential. These employees were all hired after January 1, 2009.



320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

#### 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
  - 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the files for employees hired on 8-31-16 and 9-6-16 contained TB skin tests that were read on 11-20-16 and 9-8-16. These dates are not prior to date of hire as required. It was also found that the files for employees hired on 12-15-15 and 8-24-16 did not contain evidence of a TB skin test or screening. The file for an employee hired on 9-2-14 contained a TB skin test that was read on 9-24-14. This date is not within the two (2) year timeframe required by the regulation.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

#### 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that 1) the ECE-TRIS records and files for employees hired on 11-25-15, 8-4-16 and 8-22-16 did not contain evidence of the cabinet-approved six (6) hour orientation training being completed; 2) the ECE-TRIS record and file for an employee hired on 12-9-15 contained evidence of the cabinet-approved six (6) hour orientation training being completed on 3-24-16. This date is not within the timeframe required by the regulation; 3) the ECE-TRIS record and file for an employee hired on 9-2-14 contained evidence of only three (3) hours of annual training being completed within the last completed training year; 4) the ECE-TRIS record and file for an employee hired on 8-11-25-15 contained evidence of zero (0) hours of additional training being completed during the first year of employment; 5) the ECE-TRIS record and file for an employee hired on 8-11-08 contained evidence of only fourteen (14) hours of annual training being completed during the last completed training year.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the dramatic play materials for the school age children were kept in a separate activity center room. The teacher stated that the children do not have access to the dramatic play materials on a daily basis.

## Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that an aerosol can of Zenex Disinfectant spray was being stored on a shelf that was accessible to the school age children. It was also found that the door to the kitchen, which is located next to the area the school age children were playing, was propped open. An aerosol can of Zenex Disinfectant spray and Lysol Neutra-Air were found to be stored on the counter directly inside the door. A gallon of bleach was found to be on the sideboard of the sink. All of these containers bore the labels "Keep Out of Reach of Children" and "Flammable."

General: Based on Interview, it was found that the facility did not have any documentation regarding earthquake and tornado drills.

# 1145 - Earthquake/Tornado Drills
