General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. At the time of the survey, there was no written evidence of conducted staff meetings.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

## Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, one staff file (hire date: 8/21/17) contained results of a negative T.B. test that is no longer current. The test was dated 1/2020 which exceeds the two year time frame.

#### 420 - Adequate Substitute(s) Not In Compliance

### 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (6) Child-care centers shall have available in case of need:
- (a) One (1) qualified substitute staff person for a Type II child-care center; or
- (b) Two (2) qualified substitute staff persons for a Type I child-care center.
- (7) Each qualified substitute staff person shall:
- (a) Meet the staff requirements of this administrative regulation; and
- (b) Provide the required documentation to verify compliance with this administrative regulation.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. At the time of the survey, it was found that the staff person in charge identified one substitute staff person and indicated that she did not have a second substitute available.

#### 435 - Training **Not In Compliance**

### 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and the Training Records Information System (TRIS), two staff (hire dates: 6/19/12 and 8/21/17) did not complete the required 15 hours of cabinet-approved training between 7/1/2020 and 6/30/21. **Programming**

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The surveyor toured the facility and found that the diapering mats in two classrooms (one-year-old classroom and two-year-old classroom) contained holes in the vinyl surface.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A tour of the toddler playground found one Little Tikes slide (approximately two to three feet tall) positioned on asphalt and a second slide that was the same size, positioned half-way on the asphalt and half-way on a thin foam mat. The foam mat was approximately one half inch thick and had been placed on top of the asphalt surface. This type of surfacing does not provide adequate cushioning for the children during falls.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A long strip of green tape had been used on a multicolored vinyl climbing structure in the two-year-old classroom. The tape was curling up along the edges and had collected dirt/debris. The surveyor observed a few additional tears in the vinyl surface; therefore, it was not in good repair.

General: Based on review of documentation, one child (enrollment date: 12/28/20) had an immunization certificate on file that was no longer current as of 3/8/21.

- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and

- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies:
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

## Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, one child's file/enrollment documentation did not contain information for the family's preferred hospital.
