# Deficiency Notice (Additional Text)

During the visit, it was found that 2 children were sleeping downstairs. Although the room being utilized meets regulation (other than needing a smoke detector), it is highly recommended that an infant monitor is purchased and used. An infant monitor does not take the place of checking regularly on the children, but it assists in hearing the children and you will be alerted if a child requires assistance.

Also, it was observed that diapers for individual children are separated out but not labeled. As we discussed, these items not only need to be separated out but labeled for the individual child. Thank you in advance for your cooperation in this matter.
