Based on observation at the time of the complaint investigation on 3/13/19, CCL found that outlets that were within reach of infants in the napping room were not covered.

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation at the time of the complaint investigation on 3/13/19, CCL found that the napping area had baby monitors and their attached cord was within reach of children napping in their cribs. This poses a danger of electrocution and strangulation.

702.4. There shall be sufficient staff so that an adult is always present and supervising all children.

Deficiency

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation and interview, CCL found that one unapproved caregiver was present and she was unable to supervise all eleven children. Three infants were observed by CCL in the napping room. The only caregiver present could not hear the infants in the napping room. The baby monitor in the napping room was not turned on.

Facility has been previously cited for out of compliance with child/staff ratios on 10/22/18, 12/21/16, 8/15/16, 6/29/16 and 5/19/16.

CCL accepted Plan of Correction 4/29/19.

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10. Provider Responsibilities (continued)

- **a.** Physical punishment, including spanking or shaking and other forms of corporal punishment are strictly prohibited in day care facilities. Discipline shall include positive guidance, redirection and the setting of clear limits that foster the child's ability to become self-disciplined.
- b. Any punishment or discipline which is humiliating, frightening, or otherwise damaging, is prohibited.
- c. Parental or guardian permission does not allow the use of punishments or disciplines prohibited in (4)(a) and (b) above.

Deficiency

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on interview at the time of the complaint investigation the owner of the facility disclosed that at times she calls children names such as dingle berry and numb nuts. The provider stated this was not a form of discipline, however it could be damaging to children in care at the facility.

Inappropriate discipline has been previously cited on 5/19/16 and 12/21/16.

CCL accepted Plan of Correction 4/29/19.

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation at the time of the complaint investigation on 3/13/19, CCL found that the cribs were not spaced to allow for easy access to each child, adequate ventilation, and easy exit. The cribs were placed so that a caregiver could not walk between the cribs. CCL observed that three cribs were placed under the window in the napping room, blocking the window which was the 2nd exit.

Deficiency

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation at the time of the complaint investigation on 3/13/19 CCL found that the provider did not have a daily attendance record which reflected the accurate number of children in care. Eleven children were observed by the Licensor to be in care however only ten children were signed in.

This is a repeat deficiency from 3/30/17. CCL accepted Plan of Correction 4/29/29.

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation during the investigation on 3/13/19 CCL found that there were two unapproved caregivers and one unapproved volunteer at the facility providing care to children. Two of the three staff did not have the required background checks and paperwork had not been submitted to the department.

This is a repeat deficiency from 10/23/18. CCL accepted Plan of Correction 4/29/19.
