Inside Facility 37.95.121(1) (1) Cleaning materials, flammable liquids, detergents, aerosol cans, and toxic materials must be kept in their original containers and in a place inaccessible to children. They must be used in such a way that will not contaminate play surfaces, food, food preparation areas, or constitute a hazard to the children. The intent of this rule was not met: Based on observation, CCL found that potentially hazardous items such as hydrogen peroxide, an aerosol can, and an epi-pen were located in a cabinet above the toilet and accessible to the children in care. This must be obtained and kept on file by the provider prior to residence or enrollment of any child under age two at the day care facility. The health record form must be signed by: (a) A physician licensed to practice medicine in Montana pursuant to Title 37, chapter 3, MCA; or (b) A physician assistant-certified licensed to practice in Montana and practicing under a utilization plan approved by the board of medical examiners; or (c) A person licensed in Montana as a professional nurse and recognized by the board of nursing as a nurse practitioner or clinical nurse specialist; or (d) A naturopathic physician licensed under Title 37, chapter 26, MCA.
