	Based on interview, CCL found that the portable kit did not contain the following items: sterile, absorbent bandages; a cold pack; tape and a variety of band-aids; tweezers and scissors; phone number for the Montana Poison Control Center; disposable single use gloves.				
	The provider stated that no first aid kit is taken when children and stafff are on trips away from the facility .
