	Rased on interview CCL found that dianer-changing surfaces were not cleaned after each use with an

approved sanitizer. (Clorox wipes don't have a strong enough solution for diaper changing surfaces)

(7) All toilet articles shall be specifically labeled for each infant and toddler. Each item must be separated and kept in a sanitary condition.

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation and interview, CCL found that the toilet articles were not identified and separated for each child. Several tubes of diaper rash cream was observed to not be labeled. Two packages of wipes weren't labeled.

CCL accepted Plan of Correction 5/28/18.

(6) If bottles and nipples are to be used by the facility, they must be cleaned and sanitized using generally accepted means of sanitation such as washing in a dishwasher or by washing in hot water, rinsing, and boiling for one minute.

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on interview, CCL found that bottles and nipples were not properly cleaned and/or sanitized.
