Deficiency

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation, CCL found that a fire extinguisher was not accessible on each floor. It was found that an extinguisher was not accessible downstairs.

The Plan of Correction was accepted on May 9, 2019.

Deficiency

(3) All child care facilities must have operating UL smoke alarms on each floor of the facility, installed in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications. Smoke alarms must be installed in front of the doors to stairways, in corridors of all floors, and in all rooms where children sleep.

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation, CCL found that a smoke detector was not installed in the downstairs bedroom and main floor hallway.

The Plan of Correction was accepted on May 9, 2019.

- 121.6. Any outdoor play area must be maintained free from hazards such as wells, machinery and animal waste. If any part of the play area is adjacent to a busy roadway, drainage or irrigation ditch, stream, large holes, or other hazardous areas, the play area must be enclosed with a fence in good repair that is at least 4 feet high without any holes or spaces greater than 4 inches in diameter or natural barriers to restrict children from these areas.
 - a. Outdoor play areas shall be designed so that all parts are always visible and easily supervised by staff.

Deficiency

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation and interview, CCL found that the outdoor area was not enclosed with a fence that is at least 4 feet high with holes or spaces no greater than 4 inches in diameter.

The Plan of Correction was accepted on May 9, 2019.

Based on observation, CCL found that the medication was not stored in a location that was inaccessible to children. CCL found that children may be able to reach medications in the bathroom cabinet.

Based on observation and interview, CCL found the provider did not have a written policy describing practices used to promote a safe sleep environment.

The Plan of Correction was accepted on May 9, 2019.

- **183.1.** Each provider shall adopt and follow written policies for first aid consistent with recommendations from the American Red Cross. These policies must include but are not limited to:
 - a. procedures for handling medical emergencies, including calling the Emergency Montana Poison Control Center at 1-800-222-1222 when a child is suspected of having ingested any poisonous or toxic substance; and
 - **b.** directions for calling parents or someone else designated as responsible for the child when a child is sick or injured.

Deficiency

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation and interview, CCL found that the provider did not have a complete written policy for first aid consistent with recommendations from the American Red Cross. The policy should include information about providing first aid to a child in care, filling out incident reports and contacting parents when required.

The Plan of Correction was accepted on May 9, 2019.

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
